13002 Just Some Permutation 5

Given N and K, find the lexicographically K-th (1-indexed) smallest permutation P_1, P_2, \ldots, P_N of the first N positive integers $(1, 2, \ldots, N)$, such that the adjacent numbers are relatively prime $[\gcd(P_i, P_{i+1}) = 1, \text{ for } 1 \leq i < N]$ in the permutation. A permutation of N numbers A_1, A_2, \ldots, A_N is lexicographically smaller than another permutation B_1, B_2, \ldots, B_N if $A_i < B_i$ for some i and $A_j = B_j$ for all j < i.

Input

First line of the input contains an integer $T \leq 20$, which is the number of test cases. Each of the next T lines contain two space separated integers $N \leq 28$ and $K \leq 10^{18}$.

Output

For each test case output the case number and then N space separated integers which is the lexicographically K-th smallest permutation of the first N positive integer numbers, such that adjacent numbers in the permutation are relatively prime. If there are less than K such permutations then output '-1'. See sample input output for exact formatting.
